

Two new vending machines offering Narcan, a lifesaving medication for opioid overdoes have been installed outside two of our Hilo facilities. One sits outside of our Hulihia Ke Ola Detox on Hoku St, the other at our East Hawaii Office on Wajanuenue ave.

The installation of these new Narcan vending machines is the result of the collaboration between our organization, the Hawaii Island Fentanyl Task Force, The Hawaii Health & Harm Reduction Center, the State Department of Health, Adult Mental Health Division, and the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division.

Since joining the program, David has remained actively engaged in the treatment process, diligently striving to reclaim his life. He worked with our case managers to obtain his vital documents, collaborated with our transformation coach to develop a tailored resume, and ultimately obtained employment at Waiakea Waters. Following his transition out of our TLP, he resided at our Clean and Sober house, where he worked closely with the VA to secure independent living. Leveraging their resources, he successfully secured a one-bedroom apartment.

David attributes much of his motivation to his son and shares invaluable advice for his peers in recovery: "Commit fully, remain humble, and exercise patience, keeping the end result in sight."
